### Module 6 - Activity 2

#### Le upcycling

Subject	Giving a second life to our everyday objects 'Upcycling'.
Duration of activity	60 minutes
Age	As this activity can be carried out with children as well as adults and children, it is important to choose the subject of the activity according to the audience.
Type of activity (educational, recreational, practical, other)	Educational, practical and entertaining
Objectives	To help children understand that not everything can be thrown away and that objects can be reused for other purposes. Make them aware of the need to limit unnecessary purchases
Methods (presentation, discussion, film projection, brainstorming, educational games)	Discussions, brainstorming, educational games
Forms of work (individual, group, other)	Work in groups or individually
Materials needed	Empty toilet paper rolls, coloured card (brown, white, black...), scissors, glue and black markers

Duration	Description	Material used
30 mn	<p><b>Preparation :</b></p> <p>Link the activity to a current event (European anti-waste week, the introduction of a new environmental law, etc.), an event (Christmas, bank holidays, your school's birthday, etc.) or a specific theme (summer, fashion, the planet, etc.).</p> <p>Remember to adapt the activity to the age of the children. <b>For example, we're going to show you how to make a dog out of a roll of toilet paper..</b></p> <p>Prepare a list of objects that the children will bring on the day of the activity</p> <p>The teacher can prepare a stock of objects for children who have not managed to collect the objects on the list on the day of the activity.</p> <p>This activity can be a way of organising a meeting between a recycling expert and the children.</p> <p>The teacher can organise a temporary exhibition, inviting the media, the local authority and local influencers to showcase the children's work and the anti-waste awareness programmes set up at the school.</p>	Internet, Paper, pencil Materials needed to make the object
10 minute	<p><b>Welcome and introduction:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Checking the attendance list</li> <li>- Presentation of the aim of the lesson</li> <li>- Check objects brought in by the children</li> </ul>	Dashboard, whiteboard
40 min	<p><b>Activity: Giving a second life to everyday objects</b>Préparer l'upcycling :</p> <p>Upcycling is a good way of avoiding waste and making objects you no longer want to use last even longer.</p> <p>The educator can show projects by local artists, municipal projects that respect the principle of upcycling, etc.</p> <p>Discover how easy it is to turn empty toilet rolls into dogs!<b>Les étapes :</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1.
